

## C-ID Course Identification Numbering System

C-ID is a supranumber, a faculty-driven system to assign that number to significant transfer courses, and a response to needs of transfer partners and their transfer initiatives. Each C-ID number identifies a lower-division, transferable course commonly articulated between the California Community Colleges and the Universities of California and the California State Universities, as well as with many of California's independent colleges and universities.

### Course Approval Process



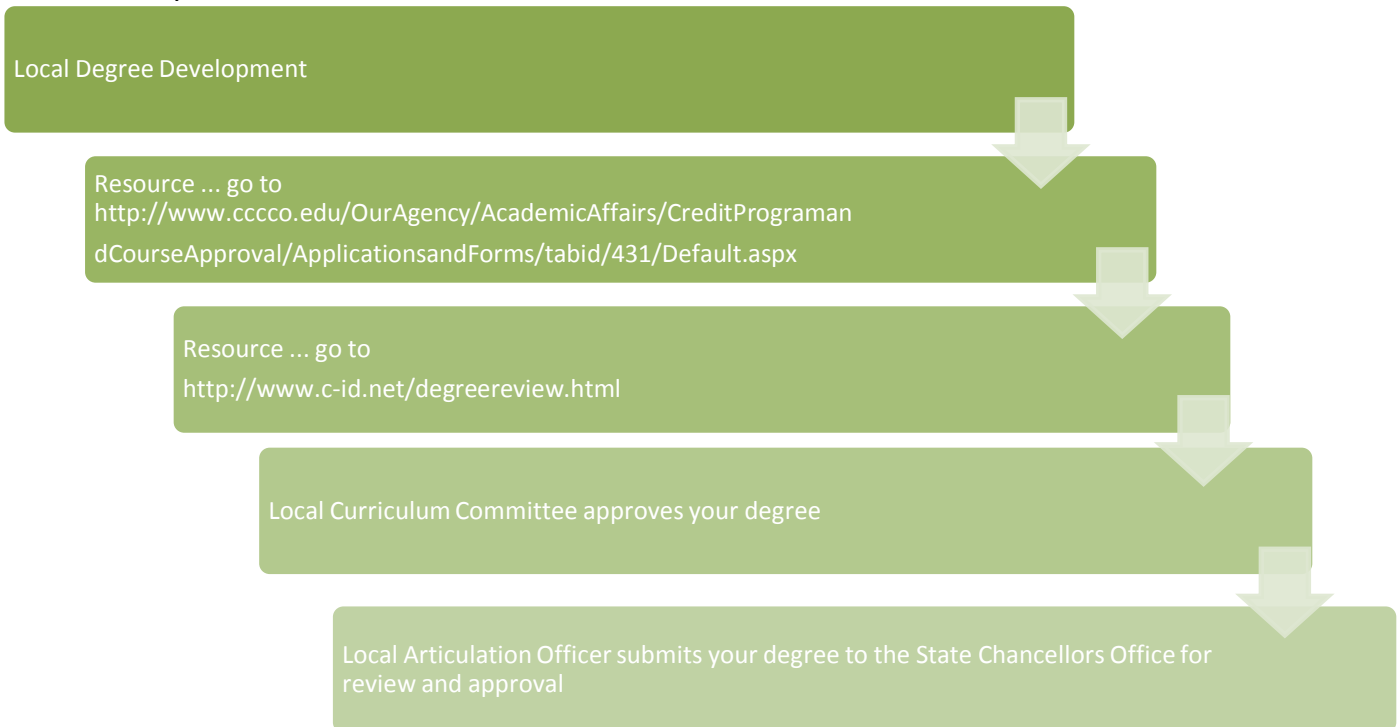
### Frequently Asked Questions

1. When should my Articulation Officer submit my courses to C-ID?  
Your college can submit your courses to C-ID at any time. You should go to the finalized descriptors prior to doing so because you will want to be sure that all of the objectives on the descriptor are included in your course.
2. My Practicum class is more than 3 units, will it be approved?  
The C-ID descriptor for Practicum is 3 units, in order to be approved; you will need to submit a 3 unit course that covers all of the objectives included in the descriptor.

4. Can my COR have more objectives than are included in the C-ID descriptor?  
Yes, as long as it includes all of the objectives on the C-ID descriptor it will be approved.
5. Do my courses have to be approved through C-ID before I submit my TMC?  
No, they can be submitted concurrently.

## Transfer Model Curriculum TMC

In response to Senate Bill 1440 (Padilla, 2010), the C-ID infrastructure is being used to vet transfer model curriculum – proposed community college majors or areas of emphasis that consist of courses appropriate for an associate degree, providing a foundational understanding of the discipline, and prepare the student for transfer to any CSU.
